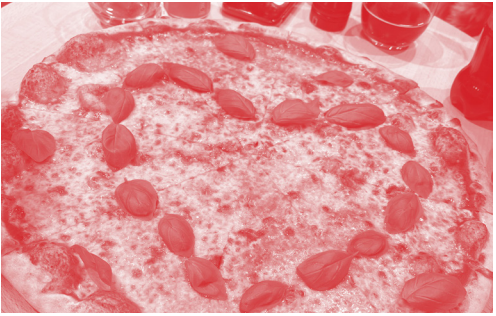
3 Café Tvaroh

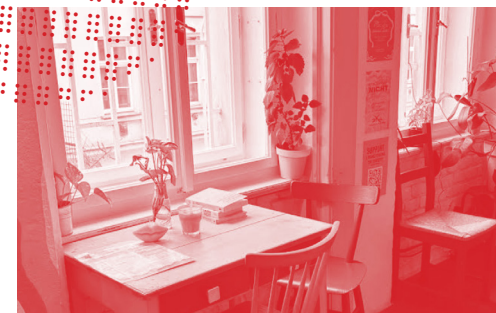
14 Prague Main Station

My best friend and I took the train here on our trip to Vienna. I love traveling by train, and this station stood out to me because someone plays the piano there every day. It's really nice.



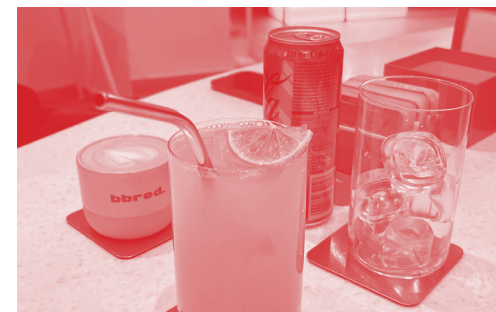
15 National Museum of Prague

I visited this museum with my parents. We all loved it. There were so many fossils, animal models, and minerals. There was also an area about the medieval era in the Czech Republic.



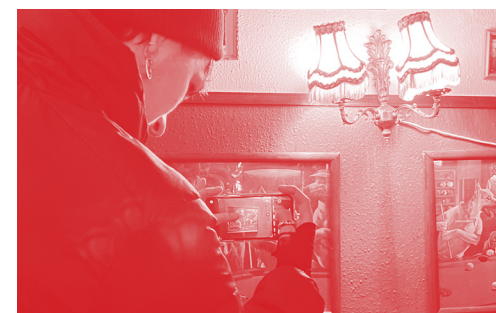
16 Safe space bookstore

Bred was the last place my housemates and I went out to eat lunch. I wish we had visited it sooner because the place was truly great.



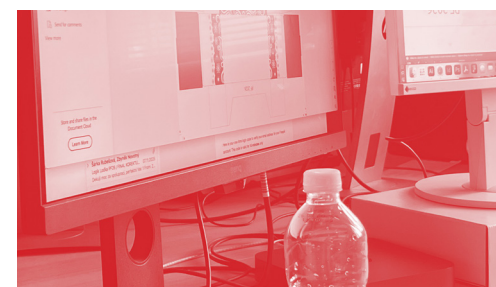
18 Café Bar Pilotů
